The Bronson Hub project was awarded to the Bronson Centre Inc., beginning Sept. 1st, 2019, and funded for the next 5 years with a \$2.1M grant to the Bronson Centre from Employment and Social Development Canada – New Horizons for Seniors Program.

The Bronson Hub is a chance to:

Learn together, build relationships, create projects and work together to improve seniors' inclusion and reduce social isolation with an intergenerational and cross-cultural focus.

Diversity and inclusion are among the unique qualities that the Bronson Centre brings to the future of the healthy community and seniors centres movement and the Bronson Hub projects will utilize these strengths in selecting project priorities.

Pat Kelly became involved in advocacy, when as a young mother working in immunology research at McMaster University; she was diagnosed with breast cancer. Pat, along with a small group of survivors, spearheaded the development of breast cancer advocacy in Canada, driving campaigns that established the House of Commons Subcommittee Hearings on Breast Cancer, the federally funded Canadian Breast Cancer Research Initiative and the Campaign to Control Cancer, which secured federal funding for the National Strategy for Cancer Control and the Canadian Partnership Against Cancer.

Alicia Borisonik Arts and Projects Coordinator



COLLECTIVE IMPACT

AGEISM

CREATIVE AGING MOVEMENT

COLLECTIVE IMPACT IS THE COMMITMENT OF A GROUP OF ACTORS FROM DIFFERENT SECTORS TO A COMMON AGENDA FOR SOLVING A SPECIFIC SOCIAL PROBLEM, USING A STRUCTURED FORM OF COLLABORATION.

AGEISM IS THE STEREOTYPING, PREJUDICE, AND DISCRIMINATION AGAINST PEOPLE ON THE BASIS OF THEIR AGE. AGEISM IS WIDESPREAD AND AN INSIDIOUS PRACTICE WHICH HAS HARMFUL EFFECTS ON THE HEALTH OF OLDER ADULTS.

THE FAST-GROWING FIELD OF ARTS AND AGING IS BASED UPON A GROWING BODY OF RESEARCH LINKING THE ARTS AND IMPROVED HEALTH. WORKING WITH A HOLISTIC MODEL THAT DEFINES HEALTH AS A STATE OF PHYSICAL, MENTAL AND SOCIAL WELLBEING AND NOT MERELY AS THE ABSENCE OF DISEASE OR INFIRMITY, THIS CREATIVE AGING MOVEMENT RECOGNIZES CREATIVE EXPRESSION AS A CORNERSTONE FOR HEALTHY AGING.
